An Apprenticeship Program for High School Students www.AlamanceCAP.com

Fairystone is a founding member of Alamance CAP, the apprenticeship program for Alamance County. We have been working with six other companies, Alamance-Burlington School System, Alamance Community College and the Alamance County Chamber of Commerce for the last 12 months to create this very exciting program. There are now six such programs in the state. NCWorks is the state agency that monitors these programs.

We have learned a lot and are very excited to welcome our first class of 14 potential apprenticeship candidates to the pre-apprenticeship summer program. This is a six-week session that runs from June 20 – August 5. The candidates will attend classes at ACC two days a week and work at member companies three days a week. This is another opportunity for the potential apprentices to evaluate the program of school and work combination. It is also an important time for each company to confirm that they are a good fit.

We are fortunate to have two candidates chosen to join us for the summer session. Gabe Redding and Justin Padmos both live in Graham. They will be seniors in high school next year. They will be working on 1st shift Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The program is supplying them with t-shirts that identify them. The success of this program really rests with how we manage, mentor and evaluate the candidates. It is also a two-way street that allows them to have an important voice. Please make sure to welcome Gabe and Justin to our company. We will be putting them with a number of you to allow them to see what we do and how each process is performed.



Glenda was a valuable employee and has agreed to help out part-time should the need arise. We will do our best to keep her busy when we can so she will stay out of trouble.



That means that in this building alone we have **3,166** years of textile experience!


We currently have 135 employees with experience ranging from less than one year to multiple employees with 50+ years experience!
